POPE LEO XIV READING

On May 8, 2025, the Catholic Church announced its newly elected pope: Pope Leo XIV. He was born Robert Francis Prevost in Chicago, Illinois, in 1955. That makes him the first American pope in history, which is quite historic for both the United States and the Church. He was chosen during a special meeting called a conclave, where Catholic cardinals gather to vote for a new pope.

Before being elected, he had a long and diverse career. Although Leo XIV was born in the United States, he spent many years serving the Church in Peru. He learned Spanish and worked with local communities, where he spent over two decades serving as a missionary and later as bishop in the city of Chiclayo.

In 2023, Pope Francis appointed Prevost as the head of the Dicastery for Bishops, recognizing his leadership and dedication to the Church's mission. His election as Pope Leo XIV reflects a blend of tradition and globalism, aiming to bridge divides within the Church and address contemporary challenges with compassion and inclusivity. He has already expressed a desire to unite Catholics around the world and focus on compassion, inclusion, and humility.

What Is a Conclave?

In the Catholic Church, a conclave is a special and secret meeting. During the conclave, cardinals from around the world come together to choose a new pope. Only cardinals under the age of 80 can vote. The conclave happens inside the Sistine Chapel, which is in Vatican City, in Rome. The doors are locked during the meeting. The cardinals pray, talk, and vote in secret. They may vote several times before they agree on one person.

When a pope is chosen, white smoke comes out of a small chimney. This tells people that the Church has a new pope. If no one is chosen, black smoke appears instead.

To win, a candidate must get at least two-thirds of the votes. After the vote, the new pope accepts and chooses a new name.

In May 2025, the cardinals met for a conclave and chose Pope Leo XIV. He is the first American pope in history.
